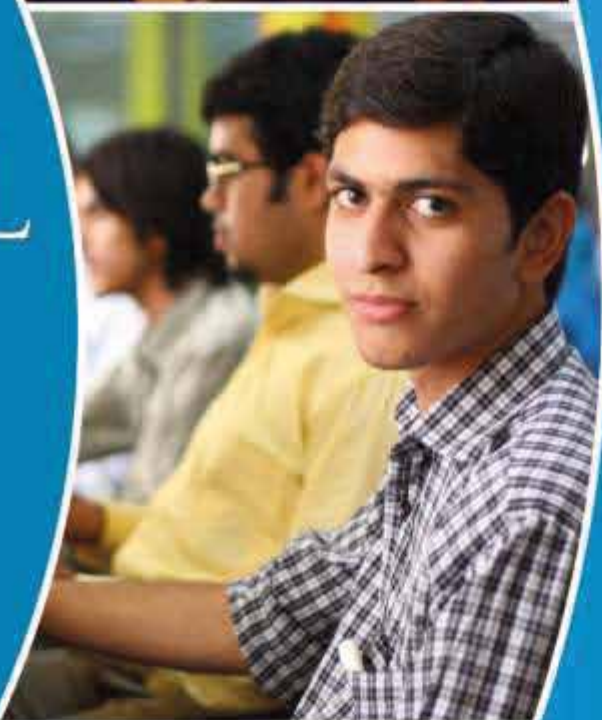

Executive Summary

CIIT was established in 1998 as a Center of Excellence of Commission on Science and Technology for Sustainable Development in the South (COMSATS) with a vision to revolutionize the higher education paradigm. The CIIT has completed its 13 years and I am ecstatic to share that the Institute has been continuously improving through out its journey and the year 2012-13 is no exception.

This Annual report starts with an overview of the Institute, highlighting some important facts like mission, vision, and structure of Institute. The first chapter befittingly covers the academic activities describing the variety of programs being offered. Establishment of China Study Center and Center for Climate Research and Development is also worth mentioning. CIIT is proud to be awarded with 1st Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce and Industry Achievement Award for its outstanding services in education and training category for 2012. The opening chapter states details of such accomplishments besides the national and international linkages made. During the reporting period, 23 international MoUs have been signed.

The chapter two elaborates the Research and Development activities, be it in terms of projects, publications, conferences, seminars, and workshops. The detail of those held during the reporting period is incorporated in this chapter. Few of the major workshops/seminars/ symposia include Technomoot, Frontiers of Information Technology (FIT), and SAICON, Pak-China Business Forum, Vice Chancellors' Forum, etc. The chapter also provides information about the research collaborations and activities, significantly, the research publications during the reporting period reached to a figure of 611 making a total of 2,589. CIIT also has the honor of being ISO 9000:2008 certified, which is the most popular standard of Quality Management System internationally. The third chapter is about Quality Assurance and significant steps taken in ensuring quality of education and research in the Institute. The Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) of CIIT was placed in the top category "W" on April 2012 by the HEC among 84 QECs of universities countrywide. CIIT understands the importance of competent faculty and to provide them with opportunities for growth

& development. Chapter four describes Faculty Development at CIIT. The Faculty Development Program of the Institute is the largest faculty development program among the universities/institutions of higher education in the country. The faculty members stand at a figure of 2,269 during the reporting period including 602 PhD's. Until June 30, 2013, 350 scholars have returned after completing their higher studies abroad and rejoined the CIIT. Faculty Development Academy (FDA) provides both pre-service and in-service trainings to cater different needs of the faculty. Foreign faculty is also hired in order to provide diversity among the faculty.

Chapter five deals with the basic facts about the students like enrollment, equity, and faculty-student ratio, etc. The student enrollment as of June 30, 2013 is 22,860. The highest enrollment was observed in Faculty of Engineering with 6,944 students.

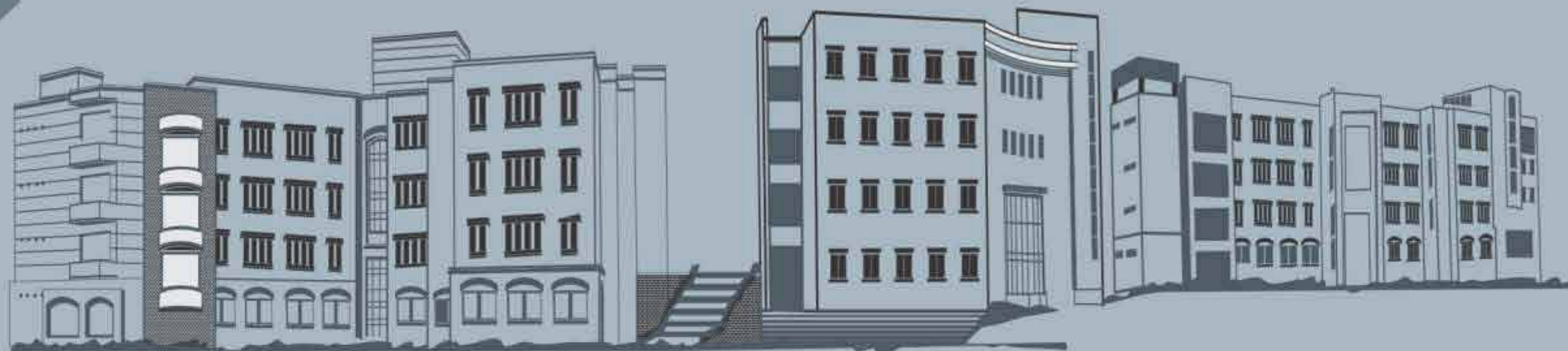
The next chapter, Universities Building Economies, contains the information on linkages established with the industry and the activities of Technology Incubation Center (TIC) in promoting entrepreneurship besides establishment of University-Industry Consortia. The Institute understands and realizes its duty of providing students with as all possible help and guidance during their stay at CIIT. In order to help them in their career development, CIIT has established internship and placement offices at its campuses which are also responsible for career counseling of the students. Different workshops/seminars are organized by these offices to make students aware of the challenges they may face in their careers.

Chapter seven and eight highlight the strengthening of physical and technological infrastructure including details of development and construction projects, research equipment, digital library, PERN, video conferencing, etc. Until the end of FY 2012-13, CIIT has completed 28 development projects, while 12 projects are on-going. New research equipment was purchased during the reporting period at campuses for a variety of purposes. The library at CIIT provides access to more than 33,000 high quality journals/ articles/ databases through HEC's Digital Library provision. Chapter nine provides information about the public service activities, which CIIT feels its obligation.

Besides education, sports and co-curricular activities are very helpful in developing strong personalities and instilling various traits. The events held/participated in this regard during the reporting period are elaborated in chapter ten and eleven. The next chapter provides financial information while chapter thirteen covers the paradigm of University Governance. Chapter fourteen tells about Office of Development, its initiatives and future plans. The report in hand ends with chapter fifteen, which provides generic details about medical/ health facilities available at campuses of CIIT, and counseling service being provided for stress reduction. The report concludes with relevant annexure supplying the date and information contained in the main chapter of the report.

Generate and preserve knowledge,

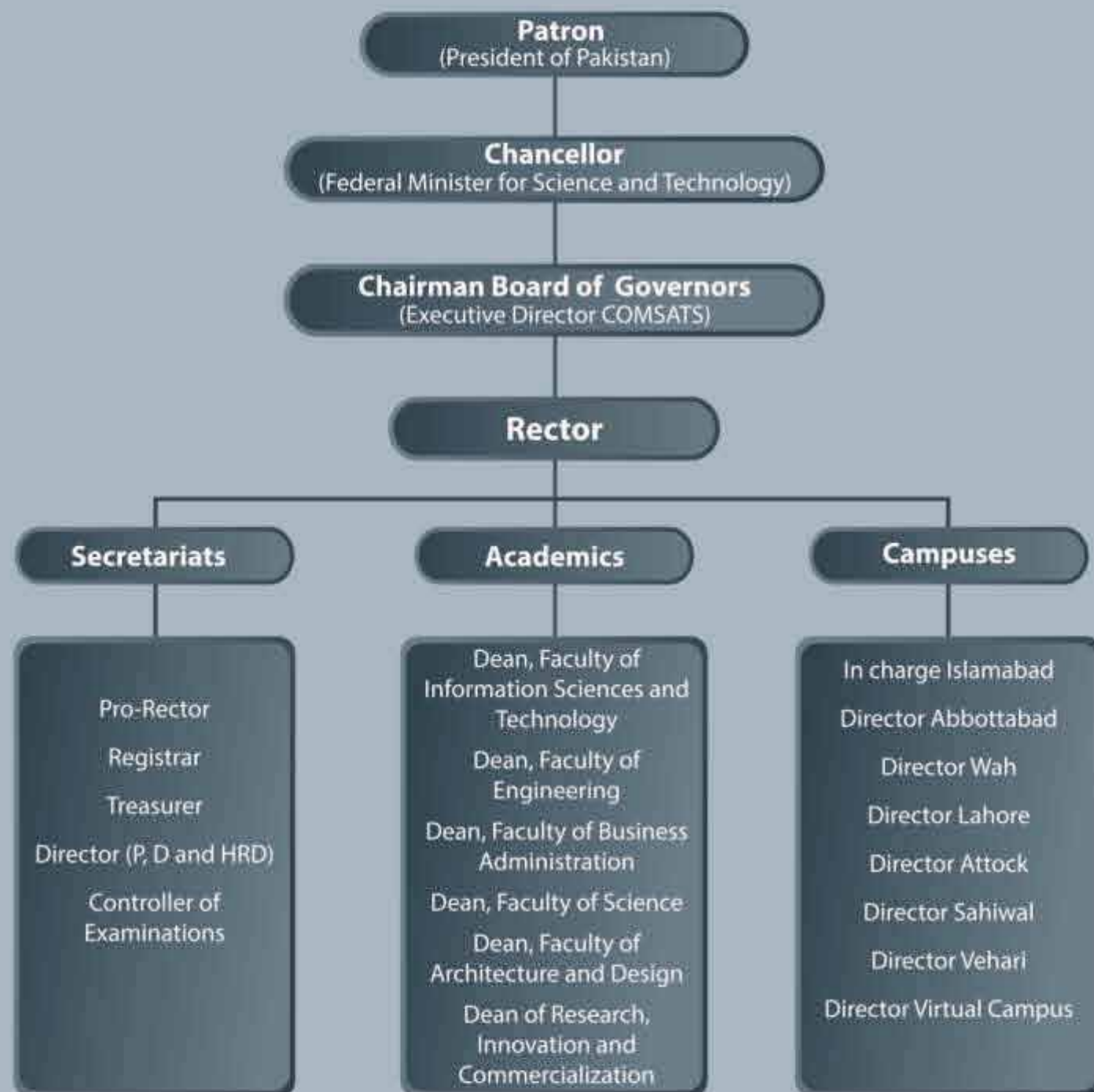

New Programs Launched: During the reporting period, 8 new programs were launched to increase the diversity of the programs offered. These were Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering, Software Engineering, Civil Engineering, Biotechnology, Psychology, Business Studies, Bachelor of Fine Arts, and Master of Science in Statistics.

CIIT Virtual Campus started with 4 programs and now it is offering 10 programs. The new programs offered during the reporting period include Bachelor of Science in Software Engineering, Business Studies, Master of English, Mathematics, Public Administration, and Master of Science in Project Management.

Academic Achievements

China Study Center: China Study Center (CSC) was established in January 2013 with a vision to promote China as the most

significant geopolitical and economic partner of Pakistan. It seeks to promote Pak-China friendship, cooperation in scientific, economic, cultural, educational, and other fields.

During the reporting period, CSC organized various events. Few of the major events included Pak-China Business Forum (March 2013), seminar on Pak-China Relations: Perspective of Pakistan and Chinese think tanks in March 2013, Commencement of Chinese Language Classes, Commencement of research on country papers based exclusively on Chinese sources in April 2013, Establishment of Chinese alumni in May 2013 and Establishment of China Student Society (CIIT) in June 2013. Besides, a talk series titled learning from China was initiated. During the reporting period, two sessions of these talks were held in March and May 2013.

Establishment of Department of Statistics: The Department of Statistics has

been established at CIIT Lahore in March 2013. The core objective of the Department is to acquaint students with statistical concepts and techniques to analyze the data and undertake empirical research. The courses are designed to develop specific skills for those who plan their careers in statistics, business, government, industry, and teaching. The programs offered through this department are Master of Science in Statistics.

Clean Room: A Clean Room/Module measuring 10x10 ft was established in March 2013 at Lahore Campus in order to upgrade research facilities and to have multi-class clean zones to facilitate appropriate entrance and exit mechanisms and Class-specific experimental work at IRCBM. IRCBM work involves biomedical materials, which are aimed at orthopedics, dentistry and skin applications - lab development, lab biological testing, animal testing and future human trials. It is envisaged that Clean Room facility will impact IRCBM's multidisciplinary research positively and will ensure adherence to ethical and regulatory protocols.



Center for Climate Research and Development: CIIT established a Center for Climate Research and Development in the Department of Meteorology in April 2013 in collaboration with Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact Research (PIK), Germany. The

major objective of this center is to study extreme weather conditions and associated environmental challenges. The center will help to improve capabilities for scientific research as well as to carry out studies and proposals on the consequences of climate change leading to formulation of adaptation and mitigation strategies.



Establishment of Laboratories: CIIT keeps on establishing new and state-of-the-art laboratories at its campuses. The number of laboratories has increased from 167 to 218 during the reporting period. Few of these laboratories are Computer Vision Intelligent Laboratory, Grid Computing Laboratory, Wood Workshop, Mac Laboratory, Molecular Medicine Laboratory, Nanobio technology Laboratory, and Proteomics Laboratory, etc.

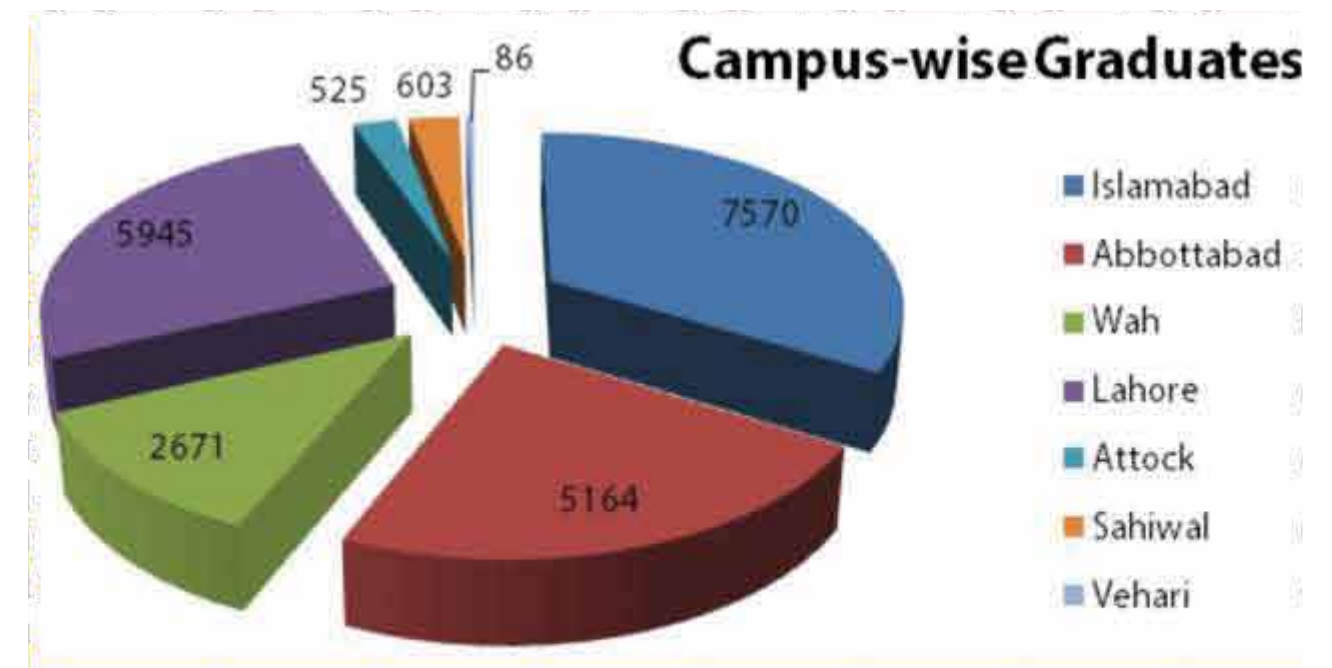
Applied Security Engineering Research Group: Applied Security Engineering Research Group (ASERG) has been established at CIIT Islamabad in April 2013. It focuses on projects of applied nature related to information security domain. The group specializes in IT Infrastructure protection, intrusion detection, identity management, access control and trusted computing. The objective of this group is to undertake research and development in the area of security information management and to execute ICT R&D funded project, "Cross

Domain Access Control and Delegation in Enterprise Application".

Convocations: What can be a better moment for a student than to receive a reward for his hard work and dedication; a degree. It is a moment of achievement and convocation is held to create such moments. Until the period in review, 51 convocations are held by CIIT, out of which following were held during the reporting period.

Till June 30, 2013, CIIT has produced 22,564 graduates out of which 37 are PhDs. During the reporting period, 4,551 graduates were produced.



Award of Laptops: 622 students of CIIT were awarded laptops by the Chief Minister, Punjab in the laptops distribution ceremony organized by Government of Punjab in February 2013.

These students were selected on the basis of merit. Out of 622 CIIT students, 186 were given laptops in the ceremony held at Convention Center, Islamabad, while remaining 436 students were awarded laptops at Government Post Graduate College for Boys, Rawalpindi.

Foreign Academic / Institutional Linkages

In order to promote the cross cultural interaction, polishing the skills and providing education par excellence to its students, CIIT keeps on exploring the opportunities to come into agreements for establishing holistic academic linkages with prestigious international universities from technologically advanced countries.

During the reporting period, 23 more international MoUs were signed with the reputed institutions and organizations from Malaysia, Italy, Germany, France, Spain, Portugal and various countries of the Middle East, African continent and Central Asian Republics.

Also in order to benefit from a mutuality of purpose, 07 national MoUs with prestigious higher education institutions and R&D organizations representing various provinces of Pakistan were conceived and signed.

The purpose of these MoUs ranges from

exchange and training of scientific personnel for cooperation in research and development activities, human resource development and availing Internships at these reputed organizations.



The detail of few of these linkages is as follows:

► **GET Lab, Paderborn University, Germany:** 3D GIT laboratory at CIIT Islamabad is working in collaboration with GET Lab, Paderborn University, Germany since November 2012.

► **The Abbant Izzet Baysal University, Bolu, Turkey:** A Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) was signed between the Abbant Izzet Baysal University, Bolu, Turkey and CIIT on July 20, 2012. This MoA was the result of the visit of Prof. Dr. Cenap Ozel from University of Abant Izzet Baysal, Bolu, Turkey.

► **Commonwealth Fellowship:** Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU) has selected CIIT to host a Commonwealth Fellow on full funding from the ACU's newly establish Endowment Fund. The funding amount is up to £6,000 and is meant to cover all costs of the visit including return air travel, living and accommodation and stipend. The

Commonwealth Fellow must be a qualified academic from any Commonwealth country who would (other than Pakistan) come to CIIT to assist in enhancing the teaching and research activity in any discipline available at CIIT through a mutually agreed program of work. The recipient would be selected by CIIT and the fellowship has to be availed till July 2014.

► **COMSATS Association of American Graduates (CAAGs):** CIIT officially launched the COMSATS Association of American Graduates (CAAGs) on June 12, 2013 at CIIT Islamabad. The launching ceremony of CAAGs was inaugurated by Mr. Richard E Hoagland, Deputy Chief of Mission, US Embassy in Islamabad.



Visits of Foreign Delegations

► A delegation from Cardiff University and Cardiff Metropolitan University, Wales, UK visited CIIT on March 28, 2013. The delegation comprised of Ms. Siobhan Robinson, Deputy Director, International Office, Cardiff University and Mr. Owain Llwyd, Senior International Marketing Officer, Cardiff Metropolitan University, along with the Chief Executive of Islamic Banking and Finance Center, UK, Mr.

Akmal Hanuk. The delegation was keen on developing holistic academic linkages with CIIT.

► A three-member delegation of the University of Malaya (UM), Malaysia, visited CIIT from April 15-19, 2013 to interview potential candidates of Computer Science under its Bright Sparks Program (BSP). The delegation comprised of Professor Dr. Siti Salwah Salim, Dean, Faculty of Computer Science and IT, Dr. Laiha Mat Kiah, Associate Prof / Dy. Dean (Post Graduate) and Dr. Abdullah Gani, Associate Prof / Dy. Dean (Research). As a result of the said visit, 18 faculty members from Department of Computer Science were selected for Ph.D. study at the University of Malaya under their Bright Sparks Program (BSP).

► H.E. Adriano Chiodi Cian Farani, the Italian Ambassador, visited CIIT on April 22, 2013. The purpose of the visit was to extend CIIT's outreach to Italy to learn from the best practices of the Italian higher education institutions and research organizations and to build fruitful academic bridges between the two countries.

► H.E. Peter Heyward, the Australian High Commissioner to Pakistan paid a visit to CIIT on June 13, 2013 and expressed his felicitations to CIIT on its accomplishments during its short history. He also discussed the strengths and opportunities in Australian higher education that could be availed by CIIT. scholarships and fellowships being

offered by the Australian universities were also identified for the faculty and students of CIIT to compete for and avail.

- ▶ A three-member delegation of UNESCO visited CIIT Islamabad Campus on June 17, 2013. The delegation consisted Dr. Kozue Kay Nagata, Director and Representative UNESCO, Islamabad, Mr. Jawad Aziz, Coordinating Officer, UNESCO, Mr. Adnan Ahmed, Coordinating Officer, UNESCO. The purpose of the visit was to explore possibilities and opportunities to work collaboratively for quality and diversity in education using built architecture as a resource.

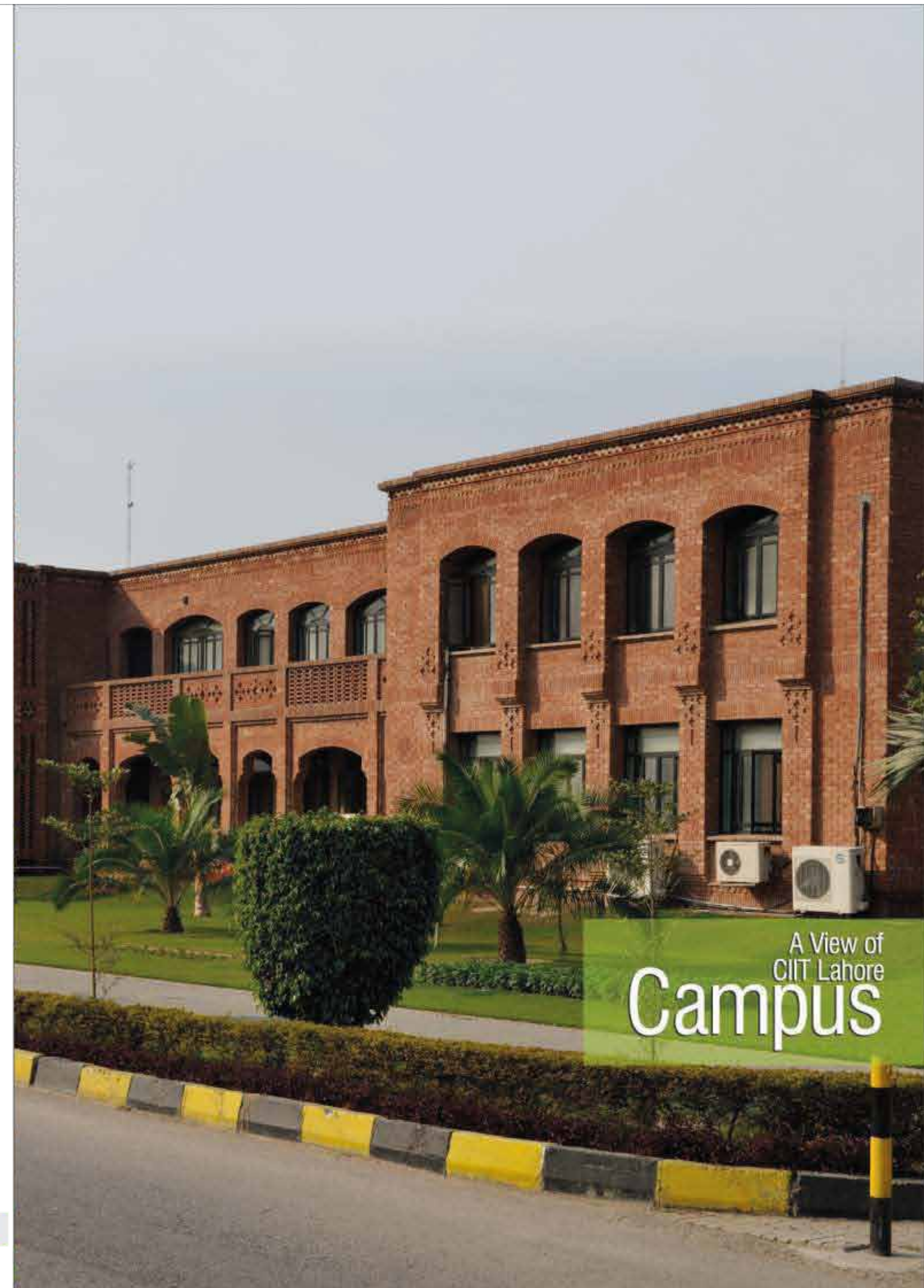

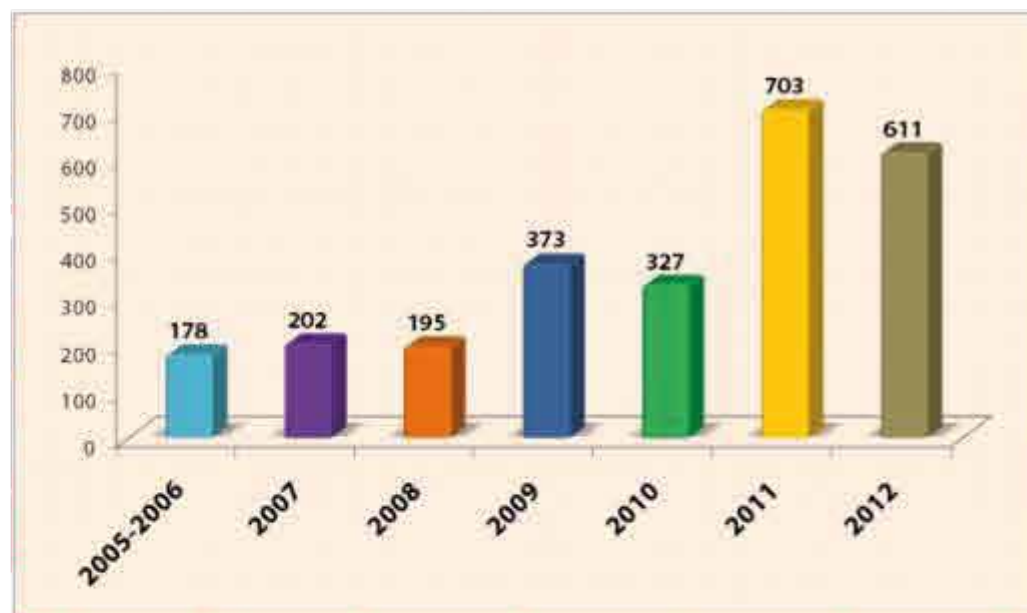

Research Publications

Foreign Research Collaborations

It is fundamental to establish international

linkages to provide students and faculty with diverse experience and research opportunities. Such collaborations are integral for better access to knowledge and technology, understanding of different cultures, creating research networks, etc. CIIT has signed more than 140 MoUs so far, out of which 30 were signed during the reporting period. The detail of some of the initiatives in context of foreign linkages is as below:

Institute of Atmospheric Sciences and Climate of Italian National Research Center, Italy: To promote scientific and teaching cooperation, the Institute of Atmospheric Sciences and Climate (ISAC) of Italian National Research Center (CNR), Italy and CIIT Abbottabad signed a Memorandum of Understanding for teaching and scientific cooperation. Prof. Dr. Khan Gul Jadoon, Director CIIT Abbottabad, and Dott. Cristina Sabbioni, Director of ISAC-CNR, ITALY signed this MoU applicable since March 8, 2013. The main focus of the MoU is to cooperate in research and carry out common student, researcher, and teacher exchange programs.

Wichita University, USA: The research collaboration between Wichita University, USA and CIIT Lahore started in February 2013. The area of mutual interest for research between both institutes is Finance. Department of Management Sciences will be facilitated through this MoU.

Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM), Malaysia: The Department of Chemical Engineering of Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM), Malaysia and CIIT Lahore joined hands in December 2012. The purpose of this collaboration is to strengthen R&D Culture in the Muslim World.

University of Sheffield, UK: The research collaboration between University of Sheffield, UK and IRCBM, CIIT Lahore started in December 2012. The focus of the research will be on Extraction of Chitosan from indigenous sources and development of skin grafts. Professor Dr. Shiela Mac Neil is the focal person from the University of Sheffield.

Queen Mary University of London, UK: Queen Mary University of London, UK and IRCBM at CIIT Lahore initiated a collaboration to work jointly on certain projects on dental material in November 2012.

Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, Thessaloniki, Greece: School of Pharmacy of Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, Thessaloniki, Greece and IRCBM, CIIT Lahore initiated research collaboration in December 2012. The focus of the research will be on Medicinal Chemistry, and drug development.

King Fahd University of Petroleum and Minerals, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia: Affiliated College at Hafal Batin of King Fahd University of Petroleum and Minerals, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and IRCBM, CIIT Lahore will be involved in joint research in biomaterials. The collaboration started in March 2013.

World Premium Institute, Institute of Transformative, Bio-Molecules, Nagoya University, Japan: World Premium Institute, Institute of Transformative, Bio-Molecules, Nagoya University, Japan and IRCBM, CIIT Lahore initiated research collaboration in June 2013 to work jointly on transformative bio-molecules/thyroid receptors.

Since 2010, CIIT has been a partner in the Erasmus Mundus Mobility with Asia (EMMA) project under the Erasmus Mundus Program of the European Union (EU) for promoting cooperation and mobility in the field of higher education. Under this program students, faculty and staff of CIIT are eligible for study, training and research work in seven European Partner Universities. Quality Assurance and Enhancement



CIIT is committed to total institutional satisfaction by developing leading edge educational practices at all its campuses, and ensuring that the highest standard of excellence is accorded the top priority. This reflects CIIT's pledge to implementing Quality Assurance (QA) processes and Quality Enhancement (QE) practices across its campuses.

Investing in quality, CIIT envisages becoming a world premiere center of excellence for education, research and development. CIIT has its own quality assurance regimen that reflects in its strategic Vision 2020, follows the quality assurance program of the Higher Education Commission (HEC) for improved quality and research, and is also in strict accordance with the international quality assurance standards.

With Quality as its integer and excellence in higher education as a strategic imperative, CIIT manifested its progressive mission by establishing the Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) in 2006, and since then, has taken bold initiatives to attain, manage and enhance quality at the institutional level in all its cadres as university management, academic and administration. The QEC, as an essential component of CIIT management, is dedicated to an effective implementation of quality standards, processes of quality assurance and management system, and continually reviewing the progress for enhancement of quality as per Quality Policy 2013. For this to happen, QEC has undertaken the development of a quality mindset in the university at student, faculty, and management levels, so that a practicing quality culture becomes one of the best

practices at CIIT.

For making CIIT a quality-centric institution, the following activities are carried out at the institution:

A. Quality Assurance and Assessment of Academic Programs

CIIT is working towards the implementation of QA processes in the letter and spirit, and is also working on the development of quality enhancement framework. These processes include the assessment exercise of all

academic programs offered by each department of each campus as per assessment cycle (currently 111 SARs have been completed out of 143 programs offered by seven campuses). The purpose of assessment exercise is to ensure the quality of programs being offered at CIIT and to ascertain that those programs and activities are aligned with the strategic plan of the department and university. This activity also provides an opportunity to the faculty to assess their own progress and get updated information on the development of the programs and department as well as the implementation of QA criteria.

The assessment process is based on the review of Self-Assessment Reports (SARs) of the programs, prepared by the Program Teams (PTs) of the department, assessment visit by the Assessment Team (AT), comprising domain expert as external member from another campus, Head of Department of the department to be assessed and QEC team, concluding in the

Assessment Report based on assessment findings and rubric, the implementation plan summary inclusive of assessment findings and corrective actions, which are taken by the department against each of the findings, and the executive summary of the entire process is shared with the competent authorities.

During the reporting period, the assessment of 18 programs of the Management Sciences and Computer Science departments of CIIT Wah and Attock has been completed.

Moreover, in June 2013 the QEC organized

training for the faculty members of department of Electrical Engineering, CIIT Islamabad about the QA process, developing the SARs, preparation of Assessment Teams and their visits for regular review and follow up in Implementation Plans.

As per Quality Policy, the Assessment Surveys have been revised that are used as integral part of SARs and are used for covering the assessment areas of courses, teacher, student, graduating student, alumni, employer.

B. W Category by HEC

As per HEC requirement, QEC is required to submit performance reports along with supporting documents as evidences on quarterly basis. These reports pertain to all QA activities and tasks, and other assignments performed during the reporting quarter. And based on this performance reports submitted to HEC by all

QECs established in the universities, HEC evaluates their performance to determine their ranking. In this context, QEC of CIIT has been rated in the top category of 'W' ranking at the highest level in 2013.

C. Quality Awareness Training

During the reporting period, presentations on quality assurance and Self Assessment process were given in CIIT Advisors Forum meetings and in the training session organized for new entrants in faculty.

D. Internal Institutional Performance Evaluation

Taking an integrated approach to quality assurance, accreditation and assessment of academic programs and quality enhancement for continuous improvement at institutional level, CIIT started the Internal Institutional Performance Evaluation (IIPE) processes at all its campuses and Principal Seat in 2011. In its continuation, from August-December, 2012, QEC has revised the strategy for conducting IIPE and also reformulated assessment forms.

E. External Institution Performance Evaluation of CIIT by HEC

In January 2013, CIIT provided the detailed University Portfolio Report (UPR) with 8 Institutional Performance Evaluation Standards (IPE) pertaining to the CIIT Islamabad and the Principal Seat to HEC for IPE, and answers to questions related to each Standard in the IPE Process Manual, along

with documents related to the UPR were also provided.

F. ISO Certification

CIIT was granted ISO Certification in 2011 and in its continuation the 1st Annual Surveillance Audit was carried out in September 2012. For this purpose, CIIT ensures that the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs); Organizational Charts; Teaching and Operational Quality Objectives are being strictly followed. It also conducts training of management representatives from the campuses and the Principal Seat as well in the Internal Audits and External Audit during August-September each year. The preparation for this audit process across the campuses is in process.

G. Membership of Associations/ Networks

To promote the culture of quality and research that is at par with the international quality assurance standards, CIIT has acquired membership of following international Associations/ Networks dealing with the quality of education:

- ▶ International Network for Quality Assurance Agency in Higher Education (acquired in November 2011 and continued)
- ▶ Asia-Pacific Quality Network (acquired in November 2011 and continued)
- ▶ CHEA International Quality Group (acquired in October 2012 and continued)

H. First CIIT International Workshop on QS University Rankings

Another contribution of CIIT is its taking the lead in organizing the 1st CIIT International Workshop on Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) University Rankings on May 2, 2013. QS University Rankings is one of the leading international ranking organizations that have been publishing annually rankings of the World's top universities since 2004, and experts from the field of QS Rankings were invited as foreign experts. The experts deliberated on a diverse range of topics related to rankings and internationalization of higher education that can lead the Pakistani universities to become World Class Higher Education Institutions.

The workshop experts were Ms. Mandy Mok, the Managing Director, QS Asia; Mr. Michael Fung, the Director of Planning and Institutional Research in the office of the President at the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, Hong Kong;

Mr. Hung Truong, Senior Manager of International Affairs at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University; and Mr. Samuel Wong, Senior Researcher, QS Intelligence Unit at QS Asia.

The workshop was attended by a large audience that included the top management and academics officials from the 8 campuses of CIIT and its Principal Seat. Besides, the Vice Chancellors / Rectors / Presidents and senior management of different universities of Pakistan also participated.

Accreditation of Academic Programs from Relevant Councils

The accreditation of programs is being done at the departmental level. The departments get themselves accredited from their relevant accreditation bodies, for example, the engineering programs are accredited by Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC).



Faculty Development

The academic vitality of any educational institution is linked with the professional development of its faculty members. In the above spirit, CIIT has carried out various faculty development programs, such as Human Resource Development program, In-service trainings and Pre-service trainings. The activities carried out under these programs during the reporting period are given briefly as below:

Human Resource Development

The CIIT undertook a very ambitious human resource development program in the Year 2005 by placing 22 of its eligible faculty for their PhDs in China. Until then, there was no HRD program offered by the Higher Education Commission. The Institute funded the 22 scholars from its meager resources and all 22 returned successfully with their prized PhDs. They are now serving at different campuses of CIIT. This was followed by yet another passionate phase of human resource development program with the development funding provided by the Government of Pakistan through the Higher Education Commission and the Ministry of Science and Technology. Another 269 scholars were placed abroad for their MS and PhD degree studies in some of the best universities in Asia, Australia, Europe, mainly in UK and US. These HRD programs have continued during the reporting period as well. Besides, the Institute simultaneously follows a generous policy to accord study leave and provides necessary facilitation to

those who are able to win funding for their higher studies from alternate sources. These include scholarship awards offered by the HEC, Fulbright, British Council, merit awards offered by the universities abroad, besides some self-sponsorships. As such, CIIT has placed its scholars in elite universities in the world like Cambridge, Oxford, Imperial College, King's College, John Hopkins and University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in USA, and some of the best universities in Germany, Sweden, Netherlands, Finland, Australia, etc.

Scholars Studying Abroad

During the reporting time, 106 scholars were sent abroad to pursue MS/PhD degrees in various disciplines. Out of these 106 scholars, 22 went for MS, 83 for PhD and one for Postdoctoral trainings, etc. The summary of all scholars who went abroad for higher studies till June 30, 2013 is given below:

While during the reporting period the male-female percentage in the faculty members was 77 % and 23% respectively.

In-service Trainings: During the reporting period, many in-service trainings, workshops and seminars were organized by Faculty Development Academy which were largely attended by the employees of CIIT. CIIT has laid great emphasis on developing competent team of faculty members who could assume responsibility of teacher 'professional development' as a passion and a sacred trust. Keeping this in view, Faculty Development Program (FDP) was established in 2004 which was later transformed into Faculty Development Academy (FDA) in 2010 on the pattern of Civil Services Academy. Its major objective is to become a potent resource for promoting the teaching profession, and help teachers become catalyst of change in our society.

These in-service trainings/workshops help the faculty to develop the effective teaching strategies, and use of emerging educational technologies to improve the teaching learning process. The brief details of trainings/workshops held during the reporting time are given below:

- ▶ A 5-day workshop from September 24-28, 2012 on Analysis of Research Data using SPSS was organized at Islamabad. Mr. Abdul Sattar, Training Coordinator and Instructor at Federal Bureau of Statistics was the resource person.
- ▶ A 5-day workshop on Understanding Statistics and Simple Statistical Analysis from November 12-16, 2013 was

organized in collaboration with US-AID Teacher Education Project. Fifteen public university teachers from different parts of the country attended the course.

- ▶ A 5-day workshop from November 19-23, 2012 was organized in Islamabad on Advanced Excel-2010. The purpose of the workshop was to give an orientation to the participants about MS Excel 2010.
- ▶ A 5-day workshop on SPSS Programming was organized in collaboration with US-AID Teacher Education Project from December 3-7, 2012. Twenty one nominated faculty members from different public sector universities of Pakistan attended the workshop.
- ▶ A 4-day workshop from December 17-20, 2012 was organized on N-VIVO-10; Qualitative Data Analysis (QDA) computer software designed for qualitative researchers. Fifteen participants from different educational institutions attended this workshop.
- ▶ A 3 weeks workshop was organized from May 13-30 2013 on Developing Writing Skills. The workshop was attended by the twenty three faculty members from various departments of CIIT.
- ▶ A 5-day workshop from July 2-6, 2103 on Managerial Skills was organized at CIIT Islamabad.
- ▶ A parallel 5-day training course was also conducted for staff members from July 2

-6, 2012. The major objective of the course was to help them to identify and build their personal positive assets while refining their self-image and strengthening their self-confidence.

Pre-Service Trainings: Faculty Development Academy also organizes pre-service trainings and workshops for the new entrants. These trainings ensures capacity-building in all the five domains i.e. teaching, assessment, curriculum support, organizational leadership, and mentoring. The following is brief details of pre-service training programs organized during the reporting period:

- ▶ 6-week Pre-Service Training Course was organized from July 9 to August 17, 2012 for 55 newly recruited teachers hailing from seven campuses of CIIT. The course covered CIIT specific information, pedagogical skills, capacity building modules, micro-teaching and some of general knowledge areas.
- ▶ The 5-week Pre-Service Training Course was organized from December 31, 2012 to January 31, 2013. 70 newly inducted young faculty members from CIIT campuses constituted the audience. The course was a unique blend of curricular and co-curricular activities encompassing traditional classroom lectures, discussions, presentations, sports and field visits etc. Best of the scholars, teachers and civil servants were invited to deepen the participants' general knowledge, CIIT specific information and also to build their capacity and sharpen pedagogical skills.

In addition, Faculty Development Academy

also arranged a 2-week workshop in collaboration with Pakistan Council Technology and Ministry of Science & Technology on Capacity Building from July 2-13, 2012 at CIIT Abbottabad particularly for 46 college teachers from Baluchistan. Since all participants were subject teacher of basic four sciences (Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Biosciences), they were provided in-depth and parallel orientation in these four areas. The course was aimed at to refresh their knowledge, enlarge their teaching skill repertoire and provide them an opportunity to meet their fellow teachers. Such courses can help eliminate biases and bridge the gap between people of Baluchistan and rest of the country.

Accomplishments of the Foreign Faculty

International Office at CIIT administers various programs for hiring and placement of Foreign Faculty. Presently, 12 qualified and experienced Foreign Professors are part of the CIIT faculty in various fields of science and technology. Their services have been acquired under the Foreign Faculty Hiring Program (FFHP) of the Higher Education Commission (HEC).

During their tenure at CIIT, the Foreign Faculty have shown keen interest in teaching and research, supervising graduate students and helping upgrade curriculum to international standards. They have also been involved in creating collaborative linkages with institutions abroad. Foreign faculty has undoubtedly contributed towards the internationalization of CIIT and overall improvement in its ranking.

Student Enrollment

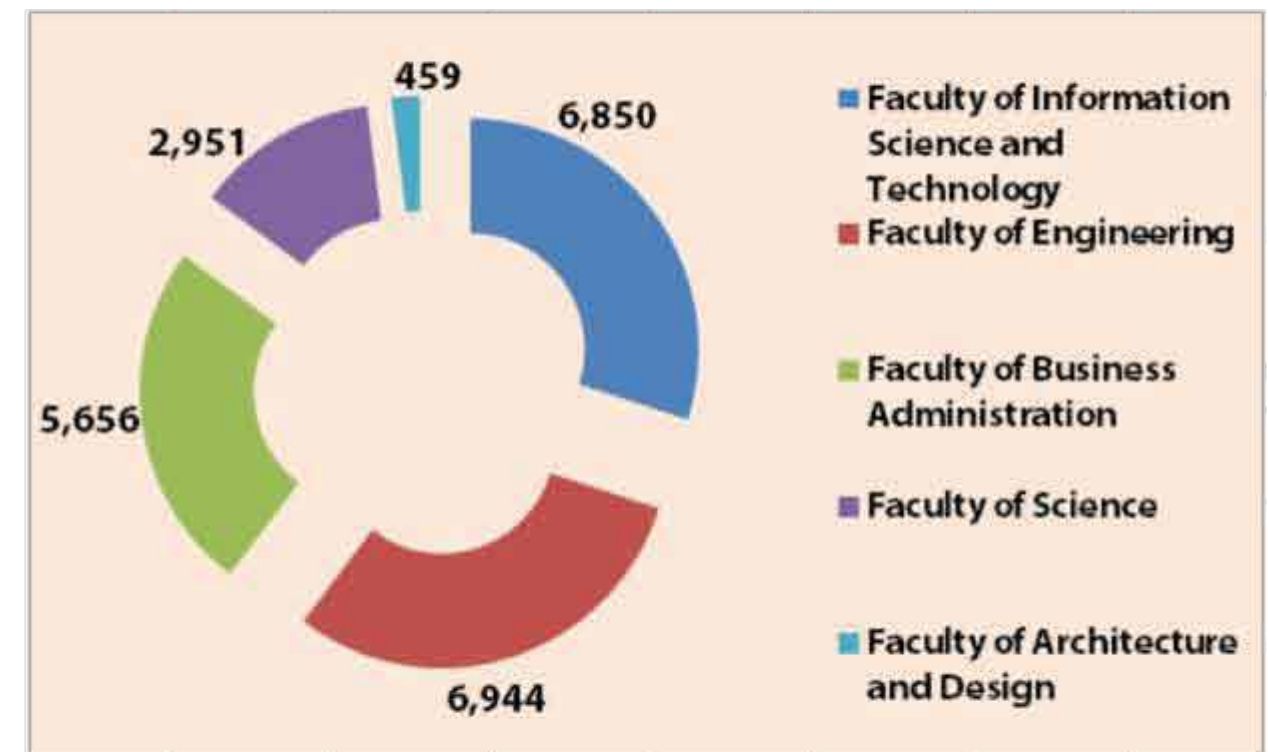

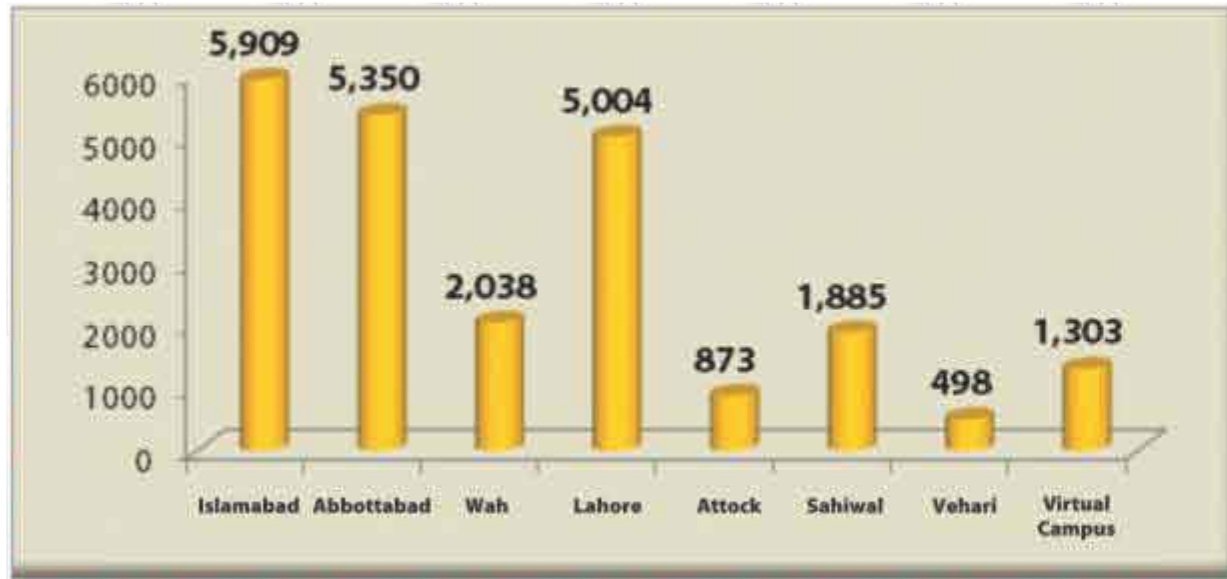

CIIT organizes Orientation Session for newly inducted students at all campuses. The purpose is to provide basic information to the students about their respective departments, their course work, other facilities, and rules and regulations. During the reporting period, all campuses arranged the orientation sessions for Fall 2012 and Spring 2013 students.

Equity

As per charter of CIIT, it is an open merit Institute which provides equal opportunities to all notwithstanding their gender, religion, race, creed, color or domicile if they academically qualify for admission to the courses of study offered. No person is denied the privilege on these grounds. Hence all the policies of CIIT, pertaining to admission, hiring, compensation, medical, etc., are formulated on this rule of business. Furthermore, a student who is eligible for admission through open merit is not declined

due to his/her financial constraints.

Gender-wise Detail of Student Enrolment

Similarly there is no gender discrimination at CIIT as stated above. During the reporting period, the males and females studying at CIIT were 79% and 21% respectively. The percentage of male, female students at Islamabad campus is 72% and 28%, at Abbottabad 84% and 16%, and at Wah campus is 81% and 19%.

Representation of CIIT Alumni in Different Sectors

CIIT Alumni are working in different sectors including Banking, Education, Telecom, IT and Development sector; 35% in Telecom, 30% in Information Technology, 20% in Banking, 10% in Education and 5% In Development Sector.

Induction of highly qualified faculty at CIIT is a continuous process. It is unyielding

commitment of CIIT to provide it students with the best. During the reporting period, the faculty to student ratio at CIIT was 1:10.

Universities Building Economies

University Industry Linkages

It is imperative to establish university-industry linkages for effective and efficient transfer of knowledge and technology from university to the industry. The graduates and the research output of the universities have to be reapt by the industry. These linkages provide students with the opportunities to have real world experience.

University Industry Consortia: Realizing the importance of this inevitable association, CIIT established University-Industry Consortia in September 2012 to form corporate advisory bodies (Uni-Industry Consortia) in all major academic disciplines to advise on research directions and commercial interests of CIIT. These Consortia will serve as advisory bodies comprising of relevant corporate sector and CIIT representatives within all major academic disciplines. It is believed that organic growth of ideas and action plans stemming from these Consortia will help achieve the above stated goal. So far, Faculty of Science, Faculty

of Information Sciences and Technology, Faculty of Engineering and Faculty of Business Administration have formulated their consortia and have started functioning.

Technology Incubation Center

CIIT Lahore formally launched Technology Incubation Center (TIC) in April 2013 by signing an agreement with Horizon Technologies software house to manifest a novel kind of academia – industry linkage that promise development of CIIT's human resource (faculty and students of Computer Science) on the industrial standards during final year projects (FYP). As per the contract, the Horizon Technology is obliged to set up one of its software development cell within CIIT Lahore which shall be manned by the students of Computer Science Department selected on merit for undertaking the real software development projects under supervision of a manager of Horizon Technology and co – supervision of CIIT's faculty member(s).

As a result, a selected batch of students of CIIT Lahore shall pass out with one year industrial experience. The selected students shall also be paid stipend during their FYPs. This model shall abreast CIIT's faculty with industrial requirements so that they train the next batches of students ready for software industry challenges. This arrangement shall also pave the road to technology incubation in collaboration with industry whose IPRs shall directly be with industry. Office of Research, Innovation, and Commercialization (ORIC), CIIT Lahore is striving for attaining two more such agreements with other software

houses in near future.

In addition to the above mentioned connections with software industry, TIC has been encouraging the Engineering, Interdisciplinary Research Center in Biomedical Materials (IRCBM) and Computer Science department of CIIT Lahore to optimize their technical research that leads to innovation in form of tangible marketable product promising knowledge economy and benefits. In this context, following initiatives are being supported by ORIC, CIIT Lahore during the reporting period:

Internship and Placement Office

CIIT has always strived to take initiatives towards the academic and professional development of students. Career Development Center (CDC) established at CIIT Islamabad is another strategic endeavor which aspires to cater to the personal, academic and professional needs of the students of CIIT. Initially, CDC was working as a separate entity, but now it is working as a sub-component of department of Student Affairs.

The purpose of CDC is to expose the students to options that best fit their individual career needs. Wherever the student is in academic career, freshmen through PhD, CDC helps them navigate their career during the years at CIIT, from choosing a major, to exploring different career options, to finding internships, to looking for part-time and full-time employment.

The prime functions of CDC include Individual career counseling for career assessment, Information sessions regarding job search skills, interviewing techniques, resume preparation, CV's database management system, access to career-related technology, assistance with internships, co-ops, and job opportunities, career-related workshops and outreach, on campus interviewing opportunities, career fairs, and industry liaison.

Some of the companies in contact with CDC are Askari Commercial Bank, Standard Chartered Bank, Bank Al-Falah, Faisal, Telenor, Ovex Technologies, Limton Group of

Companies, Zigran, AF Fergusons, OXFAM GB, Engro Pakistan, Channel 7, PTCL, ZONG, State Bank of Pakistan, etc.

Through the job portal (launched by CDC in collaboration with Rozee.pk with the name of Campus Career Portal for students of all CIIT Campuses). It contains online CVs which are readily accessible by all the employers subscribed to the portal. These are digital CVs with industry approved format and are keyword searchable. Defined perimeter for search is also featured in this system.



Following workshops/seminars were organized by CDC Islamabad during the reporting period:

- ▶ British Council Counselors Symposium was organized at CIIT from October 16-17, 2012 in which various counselors from all over Pakistan participated.
- ▶ Microsoft Hackathon was held from November 9-10, 2012 in which students from different universities of Islamabad and Rawalpindi participated and developed applications for Windows 8.
- ▶ World Bank's Water and Sanitation Hackathon were arranged from December 1-2, 2012, in which students from Department of Computer Science, CIIT Islamabad participated for the development of different softwares.

CDC has also conducted in-house interview for CIIT Islamabad students with following employers during the reporting period:

- ▶ SNL: For the students of Department of Management Sciences
- ▶ ZONG: For the students of Department of Computer Sciences
- ▶ Nayatel: For the students of Department of Computer Sciences & Electrical Engineering

Besides, CDC continues to provide in person career counseling sessions to give individualized attention to students.

In order to facilitate the students, 3D Graphical Imagery Therapy Laboratory at CIIT Islamabad also offered internships to CIIT students as an opportunity to gain experience as emerging professionals in various fields including research and development. Up till now 2 students have completed their internship in research area.

Placement office at CIIT Lahore also organized job interviews on October 13, 2012, April 10, 2013 and April 18, 2013 by M/s i2c Software House as part of their outreach program. During these interviews, 03 students were employed.

It established contacts with major multinational and national organizations /industries during the reporting period for exploring internships opportunities. As a result, 56 internship opportunities were availed by the students of this campus. Few of these are National University of Singapore, State Bank of Pakistan, TUSDEC (Technology Upgradation and Skill Development

Company), Total Parco Pakistan Limited, Care Foundation, Azgard-9, Global Recruitment Consultants Pvt. Ltd, Buksh group, Abacus consulting, Eastern Group of Companies, and Protege Global, etc.

Besides, two mini job fairs were also organized on January 15, 2013 and June 18, 2013 at CIIT Lahore. Major participants in these fairs were Mobilink, Systems Ltd, Techlogix, Panasian Group of Companies, Suave Solutions, i2c Pakistan, ZealSSA business Solutions, Mcyber, and MianTech (MT). The activities held during these fairs were Direct interaction, CV submission, and Preliminary interviews.

Other activities carried out in this regard by CIIT Lahore include:

- ▶ Presentations on best HR practices from the platform of Students Corporate forum by HR Manager of M/s LD Alliance on May 21, 2013.
- ▶ Through the Alumni Portal, placement office facilitated 05 alumni to attend an information session held on October 18, 2012 at Islamabad by Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP) in their Management Trainee Program leading to permanent jobs.
- ▶ Invited Coca-Cola Beverages Pakistan Ltd. to conduct a 35 minutes job test at the campus on November 19, 2012, in which 57 students and alumni participated and 17 got selected for final interviews.

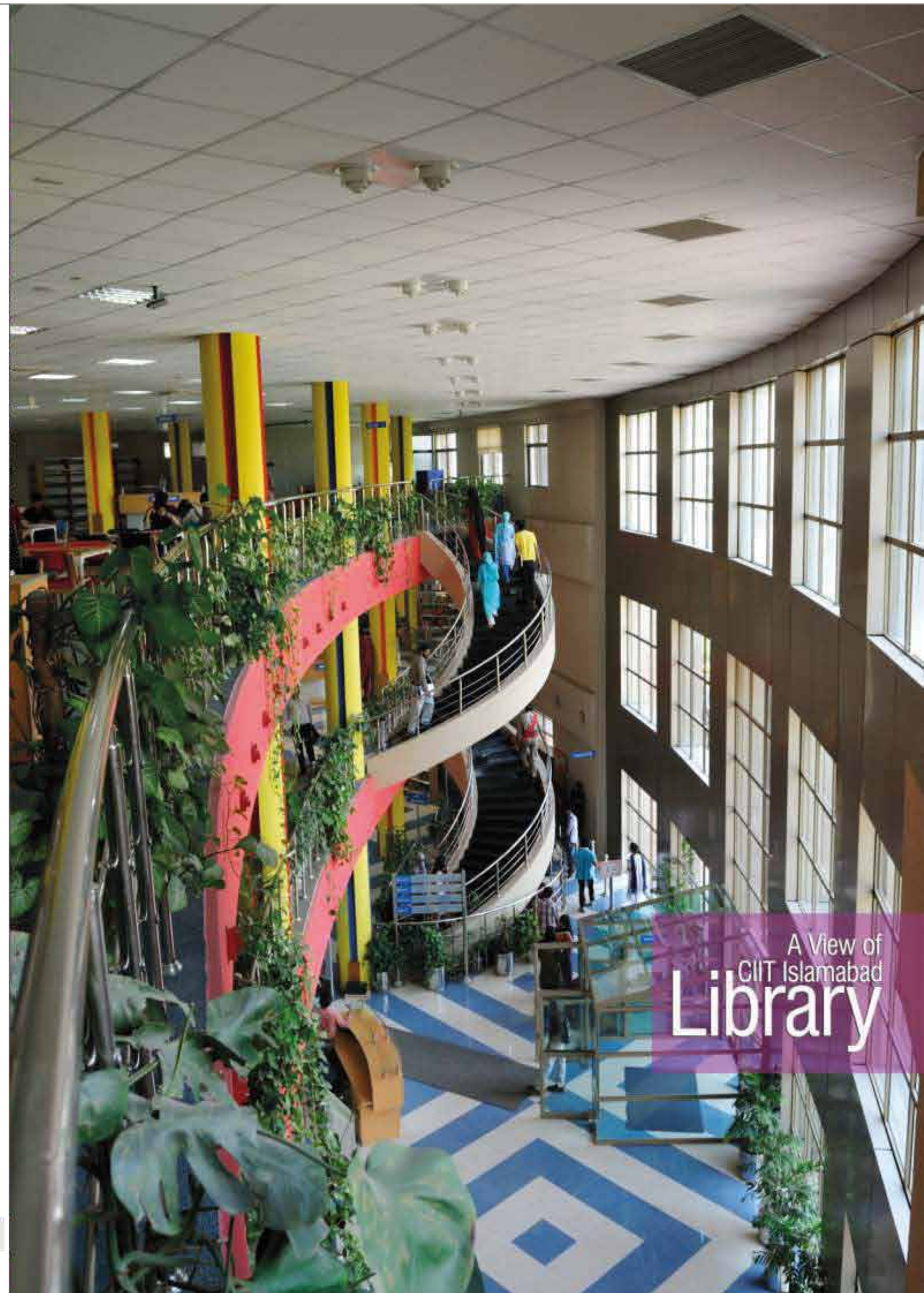

Medical centers and placement offices at all campuses are also providing the student counseling and career guidance. In this regard, CIIT Lahore organized the student

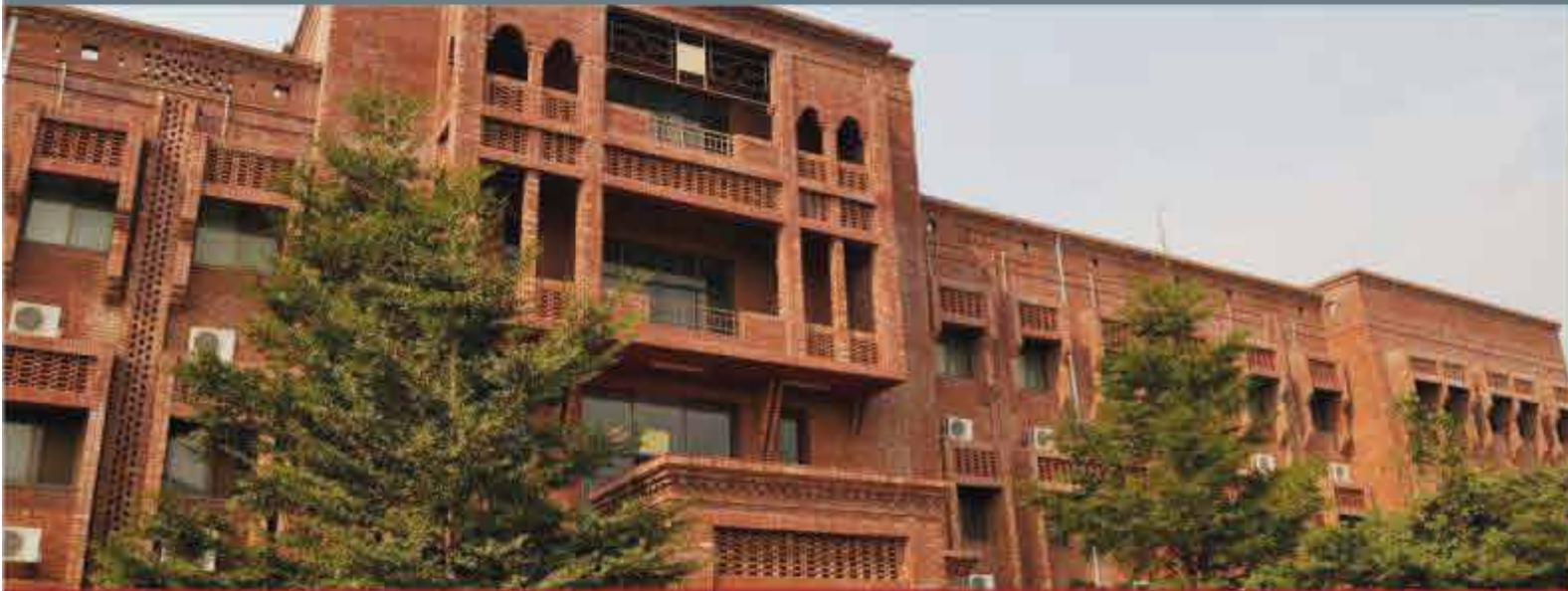

Development Projects

The Public Sector Development Program (PSDP) is the main instrument for providing budgetary resources for the development projects and programs of COMSATS Institute of Information Technology (CIIT). Until the end of financial year viz FY 2012-13, CIIT has successfully completed 28 projects

(Annexure B) having capital cost of Rs. 2742.179 million.

For the FY 2012-13 the Government of Pakistan allocated Rs. 1076.587 million for twelve (12) development projects of CIIT. During the said period, Rs. 876.954 million have been released. Out of these twelve development projects, seven are HEC funded and remaining five by MoST.

Strengthening Technological Infrastructure

Digital Library

A digital library is a collection of documents in organized electronic form, available on the Internet or on CD-ROM (compact-disk read-only memory) disks. Depending on the specific library, a user may be able to access magazine articles, books, papers, images, sound files, and videos.

CIIT Library is providing access to more than 33,000 high quality, peer-reviewed journals, databases, and articles through HEC's Digital Library program. In addition to this thousands of E-books are also offered on different subject areas like Science and Technology, Social Sciences and Humanities. Students and faculty can access these resources from inside and outside the campus through IP address and Virtual Private Network (VPN) respectively.

CIIT Lahore library developed a share portal to facilitate the library users. Variety of eBooks, audio/visual lectures of international universities are accessible on digital library. The books cover diversity of subjects for example Management, Computer, Electrical and Chemical Engineering, Humanities and Social Sciences during the year 2012 - 2013. CIIT faculty, staff, and currently enrolled research students can access Digital Library not only with in campus but from anywhere in the world through VPN (Virtual Private Network). These can be accessed through the link: <http://library.ciitlahore.edu.pk/>.

CIIT Wah Campus Digital Library has about 30,000 research journals online access for the abstracts and full-texts. The Library Serial Section also has a good collection of periodicals, newspapers and CD-ROM databases, giving most recent information to library patrons.

E-Library

HEC National Digital Library (DL) is a program to provide researchers within public and private universities in Pakistan and non-profit research and development organizations with access to international scholarly literature based on electronic (online) delivery, providing access to high quality, peer-reviewed journals, databases, articles and e-Books across a wide range of disciplines. DL has launched ebrary and McGraw Hill Collections to provide around 80,000 online books that have been made available through the Digital Library Program. The e-books support program will allow researchers to access most of the important text and reference books electronically in a variety of subject areas.

Free Online Public Access Journals

Library Information Services is providing a unique facility by collecting and organizing the scattered, free, full text, quality controlled scientific, scholarly and peer-reviewed journals. There are more than 500 scholarly journals in the database covering all subjects. The database was developed after careful



evaluation of each journal following specific evaluation criteria and will be regularly updated. These journals help faculty, students, and scholars in their research work and by providing them latest and vital scholarly contents using this platform. It can be accessed through <http://ww3.comsats.edu.pk/journals/>.

Electronic Document Delivery Services

CIIT Library has a rich collection of digital documents as it is subscribing more than 33,000 journals through HEC digital library program. In addition to this, thousand of digital documents, scanned newspaper articles are part of library and are accessible through CIIT digital library. Users can request for the delivery of documents in digital format by requesting to the Electronic Resources Section of library.

PERN

Pakistan Education & Research Network (PERN) is the only research and education network of Pakistan which was launched in 2002. The purpose of this national research and education network is to provide communication infrastructure to the universities, institutions of higher learning and research organizations to meet their networking and internet requirements. CIIT is also having PERN services since January 2011.

CIIT Abbottabad was connected to PERN in July 2007. Initially, campus started with 4Mbps dedicated connectivity via PERN1 project of HEC. Now the campus has high speed dedicated connectivity via PERN2 over fiber optics. The campus has 46Mbps international bandwidth and 20Mbps intranet bandwidth to fulfill the day to day educational and research requirements of campus. CIIT Abbottabad is aiming to

upgrade the Internet bandwidth to 100Mbps in near future. CIIT Abbottabad has also privilege of being the active partner with the PERN. It is serving as point-of-presence (POP site) for Hazara and connecting regions having 1Gbps connectivity in PERN2 long haul network.

Besides, CIIT Wah Campus is availing 16Mbps bandwidth facility from HEC under PERN Project.

Data Center at CIIT Lahore

The main Purpose of Data Center is to award a performance-based task order to engineer, design, secure, operate and maintain the department's critical enterprise-wide IT network infrastructure. It manages hardware/software, bandwidth, systems management; architecture design; systems analysis; centralized patch management; enterprise tool development, Integration, deployment, maintenance and upgrades; security; configuration, program and asset management; disaster recovery; and surge support for related but unanticipated elevations in service.

Video Conferencing Facilities

Video conferencing facility has made information sharing and communication easy and dynamic. This ease results in quick decision making which eventually leads to a better standing among other organizations/ institutes. At CIIT video conferencing is currently utilized for distance learning program (Virtual Campus), to conduct variety

of meeting through this facility for efficient and effective use of its time and resources.



In CIIT Islamabad, faculty and students are enjoying the provision of 03 Video Conferencing Studios with different options and seating capacities. Each video conferencing studio may be used for teaching or research purposes and offers the ability to hold conferences with many sites worldwide, including multi-venue conferences at several sites. All suites have full monitor and sound facilities. These suites are:

1. VTC Studio-I (Central Library)
2. VTC Studio-II (Seminar Hall in Academic Block one).
3. VTC Studio-III (Conference Room located in Faculty Block One).

All the studios are equipped with latest equipment.

CIIT Lahore has two video conference devices model Aver HVC-330. One is installed and operational in IRCBM Conference Room and second is in the process of installation in G.M. Shah (Admin) Block meeting room and will be installed and fully operational in July, 2013.

CIIT Wah also has video conferencing facility with a seating capacity of 200 audiences in

the campus auditorium.

Video conferencing facility at Virtual Campus is available through following destinations:

1. VTC Studio-I
2. VTC Studio-II
3. Faculty Cabins

All other campuses are also equipped with video conferencing facility.

Campus Management Solution

There is no main Campus Management Solution being employed by CIIT. However, different information systems at its campuses are working which are linked together and the combined software is known as CUOnline. It is developed by CIIT team of developers working in its IT-Center. It is mainly concerned about Students Records while it also covers many other areas of information. CUOnline has many modules for different administrative sections as well as

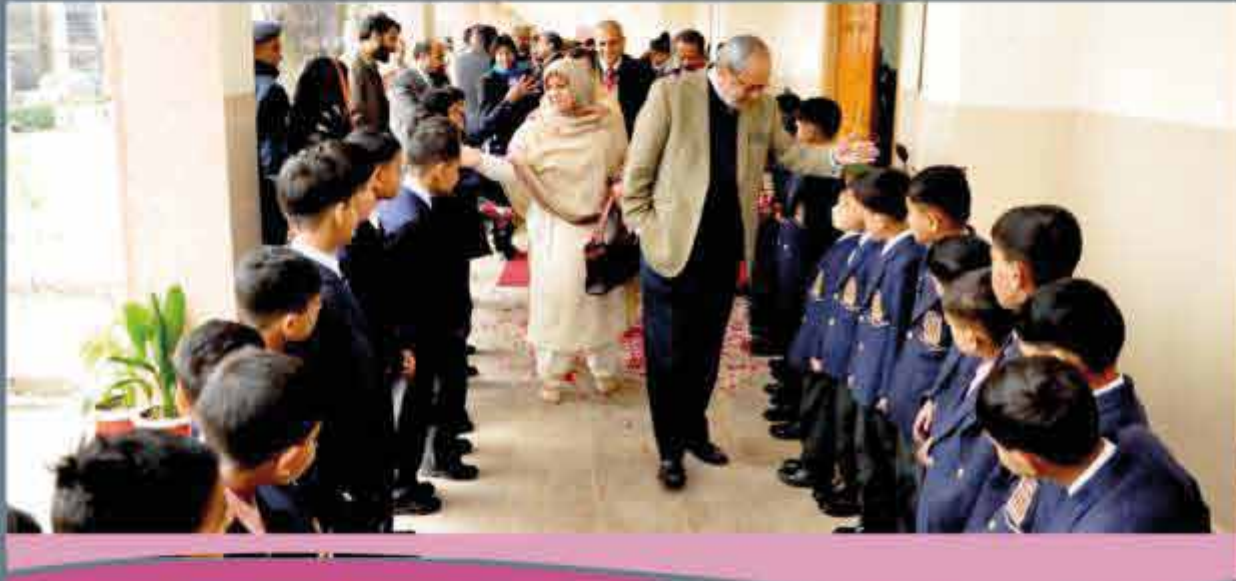

CIIT Lahore and CIIT Abbottabad have Student Information System (SIS), Students Fee Management System (SFMS) for Accounts department, Human Resource Management System (HRMS), Library Information Management System (LIMS). CIIT Islamabad, CIIT Attock, and CIIT Sahiwal have SFMS and SIS whereas CIIT Wah and CIIT Vehari have SIS, LIMS, and SFMS.

Development of Online Admission System

During Fall 2012 admission campaign, 55,940 candidates registered through the online admission web portal and during Spring 2013, the number was 18,488. University-Community Building and Interaction

Community building is an important aspect in overall growth and strengthening of the society. It requires incessant collaboration between all the stakeholders of a community. Following activities were carried out by CIIT in this context during the reporting period:

It consisted of a walk from campus entrance gate to the academic block. After the walk, information about smoking and its harmful effects was spread through posters, leaflets and video projection.

Sports

By keeping this fact in view, CIIT organizes Students Week at its all campuses in every semester. The details of these activities during the period under review are as follows:

Inter-department Sports

These activities are also crucial in the growth and development of various facets of a personality and without them it is not possible to produce responsible citizens. These activities are helpful in inculcating diverse traits such as creativity, enthusiasm, positive thinking, etc. CIIT students arrange and participate in a variety of co-curricular activities, like exhibitions, expos, competitions, etc.

It is a tradition at CIIT that Students' Week is organized biannually to provide students with the opportunities to hone their skills and to express them. During the reporting year, two Students' Weeks were organized.

The first was held from October 13-21, 2012 and the later from March 23-31, 2013. Various co-curricular activities were organized during these weeks. The detail of few of these is as follows:

CIIT Islamabad organized wide array of co-curricular activities for intellectual and personal growth of the students. A number of literary and extra-mural activities were chalked out to promote students' life. Literary Society, Debating Society, Computer/Telecom Society, Dramatics and Adventure Clubs are there to engage students in creating campus culture through social and intellectual activities.

The co-curricular activities arranged during the students' weeks included Naat and Qirat competition, Inter-departmental parliamentary debate contest, art mela, cooking show, tower of hanoi, horse show,

declamation contest oxford, story writing competition, different gaming competitions, musical-evenings, extreme riding, scavenger hunt, car and bike show, mushiara, cultural show, bait bazi, mime, and flower arrangement, etc.

A Mehfil-e-Milad was organized by Information Technology Center and Admission Office of CIIT Islamabad on February 07, 2013. The program consisted of Tilawat-e-Quran, recitation of naats, salam to our beloved Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W.), speech, and dua.

Library Information Services (LIS) held an

awareness raising walk and organized a book exhibition of recently acquired material as part of the World Book and Copyright Day celebrations at CIIT Islamabad on April 23, 2013. By holding these types of events every year, library intends to educate the educational community of CIIT about the importance of books, reading habits, and copyrights issues. In addition to this, by holding library book exhibition, library intends to provide opportunity to discover something new to users from what they are used to read.

Students from the department of Architecture, CIIT Islamabad participated in the following painting competitions during the reporting period:

- ▶ Painting competition organized by Institute of Space Technology in October 2012 during world space week in which CIIT won the second and third prize/Cash Awards.

- ▶ Painting competition held during National Festival of Culture & Democracy organized by Lok Virsa Islamabad, in November 2012 in which CIIT won third and fourth prize.

CIIT Abbottabad organized an inter-department puzzle game in which students of department of Pharmacy were the winners. Students of Bachelor of Software Engineering came out shining in Luddo single and double games. Besides, different bodies like AADRISH, COMSATS Literary Society, and FUNKADA at CIIT Abbottabad are also actively engaged in organizing such activities.

The events organized by AADRISH included poster, sketching, and photography competition. COMSATS Literacy Society was involved in the events of Naat and Qirat competition, bait bazi, English and Urdu declamation whereas FUNKADA stick to its expertise and arranged sofiyana kalam and drama competitions.

CIIT Wah also organized various co-curricular activities during the students' weeks. A Ghazal Night was arranged on October 15, 2012 in which local ghazal singers participated. Also a Mehfil-e-Mushaira was arranged on October 17, 2012. The country's famous poets Mr. Anwar Masood and Mr. Sarfraz Shahid entertained the audience with their humorous poetry. The department who was bestowed with first position in Naat completion was Computer Science and in Qirat competition the department of Management Sciences. A funfair was held on October 16, 2012. Students had various stalls which varied from edibles to clothes and other accessories of daily life. The most popular stall amongst all was of song dedication.

Talent Hunt was organized on October 17 2012 at CIIT Lahore. Students were selected to compete for various skills such as singing, acting, and dancing etc. About 700-900 students attended this event. Rizwan Anwar, Sami khan (Lagaan Band), Moez and Faheem were the judges for the competitions.

First round of HEC Allama Iqbal shield was held at CIIT Lahore. In Pakistan there are typically two types of educational institutions in the public sector; in the first group a bi-cameral governing structure in the shape of Senate and Syndicate is in place while in other group, uni-cameral system is prevalent with either a Syndicate or a Board of Governors (BoG).

CIIT falls in the second category having only the Board of Governors. BoG supervises and controls administrative, academic, and financial affairs, and lays down policies of the Institute. The meeting of BoG is held biannually, and is chaired by Executive Director, COMSATS. The members of BoG include:

1. The Executive Director, COMSATS, who shall be the Chairman of the Board;
2. The Rector;
3. The Secretary, Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of Pakistan or his nominee;
4. The Secretary, Ministry of Education, Government of Pakistan or his nominee;
5. The Chairman, Higher Education Commission or his nominee;
6. One person to be nominated by the Educational NGOs;

7. The Directors of the campuses of the Institute;
8. Two deans to be nominated by the Managing Committee of COMSATS;
9. Three persons of outstanding merit to be nominated by the Managing Committee of COMSATS; and
10. The Registrar of the Institute, who shall be the Secretary.

Office of Development



Office of Development (OoD) was established and functional at CIIT since 2009 and since then is functional. There are two distinct parts of this office, namely the Endowment Fund and the Comsian Association (Alumni related). The activities of OoD during the reporting period are stated below:

Initiatives and implementation

► **Establishment of Students Financial Aid Office:** The Students Financial Aid Office (SFAO) was established to provide an opportunity for talented students who are financially incapable of meeting costs of education at CIIT. It also improved access to higher education, especially to those who are from far

flung areas of Pakistan. Various scholarships/financial assistance schemes are provided under the banner of Students Financial Aid Office. Few of these are tabulated below:

► **Workshop on SFAO and Scholarship Schemes:** Office of Development conducted a full day training workshop on managing SFAO on June 25, 2013 which was attended by 32 participants from all campuses of CIIT. The main theme of the workshop was to create awareness on all scholarship schemes

available with Office of Development. The three most important and capital intensive projects discussed were, the HEC need based scholarship, the ICT R&D scholarship and CIITEF Scholarships, the combined yearly disbursement being in the vicinity of rupees 255 million.



► **Telenor campus branding (Fund raising activity):** CIIT Endowment Fund signed campus branding agreement with Telenor in August 2012 at three main CIIT campuses; Islamabad, Lahore and Abbottabad for the sole purpose of fund raising. An amount of Rs. 5.5 million had been raised through this activity. Telenor displayed banners at different locations in the said campuses.

► **Visit of National Management College (NMC):** 21 personnel from National Management College-Inland Study Tour visited CIIT Islamabad campus on May 21, 2013 for building industry-academia relationship.

OoD at various CIIT campuses provides linkage between alumni and industry by regular posting of jobs and internships on CIIT Alumni web portal. Approximately more than 4,500 jobs have been posted in year 2012-13.

During the reporting period, OoD organized the following events:

► **Workshop on CV Writing for CIIT students:** One day workshop on CV Writing was held at CIIT Islamabad with purpose of grooming CIIT students and making them capable of presenting their academic credentials in best possible manner. Syed Imran Shah, HR consultant at UCH Power Project was anchor of the workshop.

► **Alumni - Freshmen interaction:** OoD organized a Freshmen-Alumni interactive session on September 11,

2012. Freshmen admitted in Fall-2012 were invited for an informal session with old CIIT students (CIIT Alumni/Comsian), who joined CIIT 10 years ago and are now working in various industries, to share their practical experience, provide tips on pitfalls to avoid and highlight key success factors.

Future Plans of Office of Development

► Strengthening SFAO at each campus of the Institute. All financial aid windows shall be placed under this office. Financial Aid software will be developed to manage this set up.

► Launch of Alumni Association of CIIT primarily at campuses and then at the center.

► Fund Raising scheme for increasing

number of international students at CIIT

The sub-office of OoD started working at CIIT Abbottabad in June 2011. The prime objective of the office is to build a substantial asset base to ensure the support provided to the talented and deserving students through the CIIT Endowment Fund Scholarship. In this

Health Center / Medical Facilities

Medical Facilities

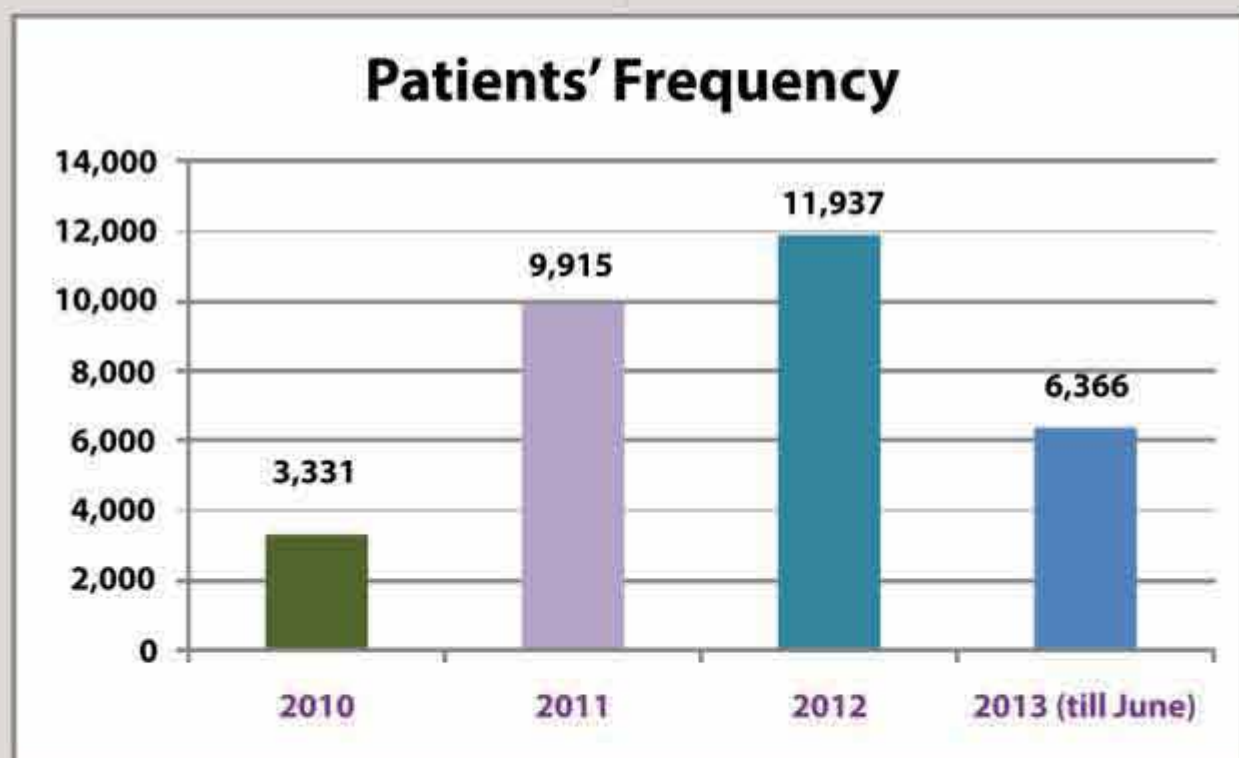
CIIT has health / medical faculties at its all campuses, to meet the emergency situations. The detail of the medical facilities available at campuses is given below:

Medical Centre at CIIT Islamabad was established in 2009. The center is functioning 6 day a week, from where four Medical Officers, two Staff Nurses and two Nursing Assistants are working in two shifts under the supervision of, Syed Masood Ahmad Pasha (Consultant Thoracic Cardio Vascular Surgeon).

Medical center offer its services to the students, guests, staff and their families. The number of the patients given medical treatment since 2010 is presented in the chart below:

Moreover, about 2,000 patients have been referred to tertiary care hospital Federal Government Polyclinic Hospital Islamabad for admissions / treatments in emergency, medical, surgical, gynae./obs., orthopedic, pediatrics and cardiology wards.

The services offered at Health Center are consultation, first aid management / vital signs monitoring, nebulization / oxygen inhalation, random blood sugar testing with Glucometer, E.C.G, dressings/cut wound stitched, securing haemostasis in case of bleeding from nose/deep wounds, stabilizing patients in case of hypo or hypertension / shock, counseling / psychotherapy, minor surgical procedures, three beds for observation / retention (separate for male & female patients). Besides, different sort of the of emergencies like Minor Emergencies, Fainting / Unconsciousness / Fits, SOB (signs



of breathlessness), Minor RTA's, Chest Pain (first aid before shifting to hospital) etc. are also dealt. Moreover, a fully quipped ambulance is available for emergency.

Medical center also maintained the life saving and other essential drugs, which are provided free of cost to the patients. During the reporting period medicines worth of Rs.1.5 Million were provided to the students, staff and their families, which were procured through donations.

In future, medical center will increase the number of observation beds from 3 to 10, and will provide the facility of complete initial medical checkup, at the time of joining service and annual medical checkup to the employees.

Medical center in CIIT Abbottabad became operational in April, 2006. Currently, a Senior Medical Officer, Dispenser and a Peon are associated with the center. The facilities provided to the patients include; provision of

first aid, counseling and psychological assistance of students, dressings / ASDs, stitching of minor wounds / injuries, Injectable i/v, i/m and vaccines, nebulization / oxygen inhalation, sugar testing through Glucometer and wheel chair etc. and the serious emergencies are referred to nearest hospitals. Total number of patients visited at medical center during the reporting period is 6,604.

Besides, medical center also provides the medical cover during any event (e.g. conference, sports, etc.), maintained record of hypertensive patients and organized various awareness campaigns. To place the First Aid Boxes In all blocks of the campus, a three days training on Basic First Aid was also organized by the Medical Center from December 11-13, 2012.

A Health Center at CIIT Lahore is operational. A Resident Medical Officer, a Dispenser and a Helper are available at the center to take care of the patients. The available facilities

include; first aid, blood pressure apparatus, sugar checkup apparatus, weight machine, treatment of general deceases like fever, flu, pains etc. drip facility, oxygen cylinder, nebulizer, thermometer, medicines, refrigerator for medicines, etc. whereas, an ambulance is also available to shift patients to the nearby hospitals in case of any emergency.

The frequency of the patients visited to the medical center during the reporting time was about 60 patients per day. Out of those more than 80% were students.

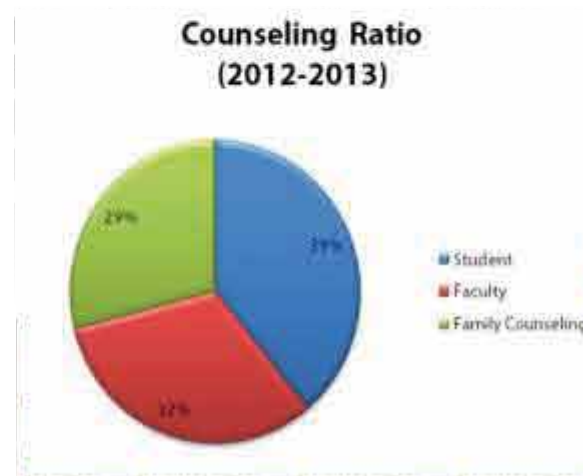
First Aid facility is also available at Wah, Sahiwal, Attock and Vehari campuses to deal with any unforeseen situations, as well as a qualified dispenser and an ambulance is available at Sahiwal campus for any emergency.

Counseling for Stress Reduction

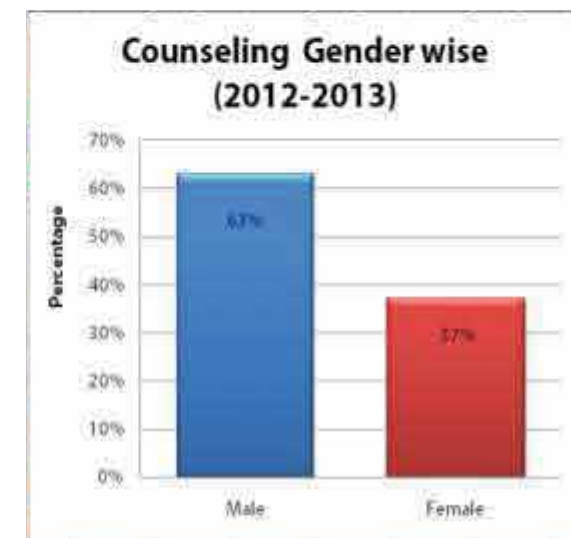
To facilitate emotional, interpersonal, and intellectual development of the individuals, counseling services are provided in CIIT campuses. The purpose of these counseling sessions is to enable individuals to navigate towards greater self-sufficiency and effectiveness.

A Counseling and Psychology Center headed by Ms. Sadaf Sajjad (Clinical psychologist), is operational at CIIT Islamabad, to facilitate students and faculty members by providing emotional support, imparting life skills, and encouraging self-reflection.

The progress of the counseling services can be seen through the data during the reporting time. The ratio of clientage is as follows:

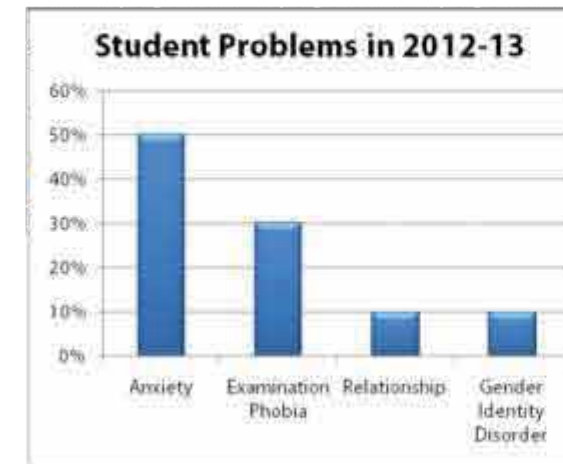

depression and stress, a Counseling center at CIIT Attock was established in 2013. The center provides a self-assured outreach services to students including eradication of mental and social stress, depression, anxiety and other mental illnesses. More than 100 persons have been examined since the inception of the center.

At CIIT Lahore, Counseling services are provided to the students in their academic, psychological, and social issues through specialist staff at the medical center. Psychological advice is provided by Clinical Psychologist, normally by appointment.
